Report to School Council Thursday November 22, 2018

PD Handbook Feedback School Year Calendars Feedback School Plan review School Budget review AERR (Annual Education Results Report 2017-18) will be reviewed in January.

One Book, Five Schools- We look forward to our 5th year of this family literacy project with 5 schools! Joining HAS, ISS, and Canyon will be Livingstone School and St. Mike's School. Another great title has been chosen, and 830 books have been ordered for this mystery title. The project will run the last week of January and the first week of February, to include Family Literacy Day.

Story Theatre - We have the possibility of once again hosting Story Theatre on March 19 or 20th for a full day experience at our school. The day starts with a 50 minute performance, classroom workshops through the day, and end-of-day school-wide assembly. Total cost is \$1890 for the day, and we are wondering if School Council is interested in sharing the cost.

Forest School Practitioners Course - Kara Kulak and Myrna Dembicki attended a 5 day intensive course outside of Bragg Creek, hosted by the Child and Nature Alliance of Canada. This course reviewed topics and skills related to planning for and working with children in outdoor settings: e.g.e site assessment, risky play, storytelling, fire skills, saw and knife skills. Child and Nature Alliance Canada is looking at our school as a flagship model for incorporating the forest school concept into a public school setting. Before becoming certified FS Practitioners, Kara and Myrna have one year to complete various assignments.

Outdoor Classroom- In the last month Grumpy's Landscaping has planted 6 young evergreens, set up the garden beds, placed several large rocks, installed tables with 'wood cookie' tops, and place the garden shed built by NIT students. Students have been enjoying this area during recesses and outdoor learning times. The septic tanks will be excavated soon.

Thank you to Grade 2 for hosting the school's **Remembrance Day Service**. It was very positively received by all in attendance with our students doing a wonderful job.

Sub Teachers and EAs have become very challenging to find. This is a concern for not only rural schools across southern Alberta but larger centers such as Lethbridge as well. Ads are posted on the LRSD website and will be put into our local paper in hopes of recruiting personnel.

Gr. 1-3 Ski Program - PPK is again offering 4 days of lessons to students in Gr. 1-3. Fees remain the same as last year. Dates: January 10, 17, 24 and Feb 7. Forms and

information will be coming home the first week in December. Those not skiing will be offered an alternate program at HAS.
