

#### Student-led conferences

From the school perspective, this is a very exciting event. Staff enjoy seeing the interaction between students proudly sharing their learning and success with families. Attendance for the evening was about 80% of students. This is lower than some other student-led conference evenings, but several families had cancel their appointments due to illness.

## **Our School survey**

Of our 161 families, 92 parents completed the annual OurSchool survey. This gives a response rate of 57%. Generally, the results were very favourable, with rating from 7.5/10 to 8.7/10 in 7 areas. The lowest rating of 7.5 is related to parents supporting at home-e.g. discussion, encouragement, homework. The lowest rating was about homework, but it's important to note that very little homework is sent home with students. Two open-ended questions were asked of parents and, overall, the comments reflected parent satisfaction. A visual summary of the results are shown here:



# **Budget**

Due to the Alberta election, everything is 'on hold' with Alberta Education. LRSD will not receive budget information until late May, and schools will submit the 2019-20 budget to Central Office in June. This does not allow us much time to share info with School Council and staff before the summer break.

### **Outdoor Learning Environment**

Olds College Horticulture Program students were at HAS on April 9 and 10th. During the focus group conversations, stakeholders offered their ideas for the design of Phase II for out outdoor learning area. Several community member, Central Office staff and HAS teachers participated in small group brainstorming, guided by the Olds students. They will create designs as the culminating assignment of their "Sustainable Sites" course, and will share these with us. From there we can determine how to further develop our area.

### 2019-2020 School Calendar

HAS, ISS, and CCHS have enough instructional hours over the year that we have requested additional professional development days. These are: Oct.18, 2019 for progress conversations (to replace our annual Intake Conversations), Feb. 7, 2020 for joint-school work on our place-based planning, and June 12, 2020 for transition meetings between schools.

### **Promotional video for HAS**

Erv Fehr Productions from Lethbridge is creating short, promotional videos about all the schools in LRSD. Mr. Fehr has been in touch with HAS recently, and some filming will start soon. As a promotional video the question is asked: What information do we want parents who are watching? Your input is needed on this. The video will include footage inside and outside the school, including student learning in Flumerfelt Park , and interviews of parents , staff, and a couple of students.

## **National Attention**

Our 'expanding boundaries' playground project and Kelso's Choices conflict management program, the staff training and commitment to the philosophy and benefits for students of "Risky Play", and the environmental focus of our Eco Club, have brought attention and recognition to Horace Allen as a public schools leader! The Child & Nature Alliance of Canada is considering our school as a 'promising practice' model in a nation-wide campaign. We have also been chosen as a site to host one of their courses in June. The Alberta Teachers' Association awarded HAS a Communities of Practice grant to sponsor the "Risky Play" workshop which will be featured in the ATA publications. A representative of the Alberta Council of Environmental Education (ACEE) helping communities promote outdoor learning is interested in showcasing our work!
