Report to School Council January 19, 2021

Enrollment: We continue to welcome new students to HAS. Since the last council meeting in November ,1 new student has joined our classrooms and another is starting soon. Three current students will return to HAS from at-home learning, and three current students will start at-home learning February 1. Our total in-school enrollment will be 194, and the at-home learners enrollment will be 16, for a total student enrollment population of 210.

One Book, Five Schools - The countdown is on for the start of the 8th Annual #1Book5Schools event! Just over a week until 850+ households start reading together. Watch for your book coming home Jan. 27. (Jan. 28 for K2 students) We are grateful to the LIteracy Foundation for their help in organizing the event, and to TC Energy and FCSS for paying for the books.

Recycling - Thank you to School Council for supporting this program, which is up and running well.

Author Visit - Thank you to the Literacy Foundation for their support in bringing Alberta Author Marty Chan to the classes, virtually. Mr. Chan told traditional stories he learned growing up, talked about his cats who inspired his first picture book, and made magic. We have ordered copies of Marty Chan's books for our Learning Commons, and as student prizes for future events.

Our first week back after the Christmas break with at-home learning went well for most families. Having used SeeSaw in the spring and now as a way of communicating with families all fall made the transition to at -home learning a little less daunting for all involved.

Volunteers - As we look to reinvigorate our outdoor learning experiences, we are seeking parent volunteers. These outdoor volunteers will follow school procedures as determined by COVID.

ECO Club -Modified this year due to COVID. Grade 2 classes will take turns with meetings and leading activities for the school.

Food Bank Donation from HAS in December - \$560 in cash; \$500 in gift cards.
